



During August 2015, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 219 incidents. This compares to August 2014 when officers handled 211 incidents.




## Adult Cases referred to the District Attorney's Office – 7




Cases referred to the District Attorney's Office included Sex Offender Registration Violation, Criminal Damage to Property and Illegally Obtaining Prescription Medication.



The above matter having come before the Court on the plaintiff's motion for default judgment, all pursuant to Section 806.02(3), Wis. Stats. Based upon the motions and file herein, the court hereby finds as follows:

- 1) That the defendant vehicle is presently stored within the jurisdiction of this court at the Village of East Troy Police Department.
- 2) That on or about April 6, 2015, the defendant vehicle was used to transport any property used in the commission of a felony, to-wit: Possession of a Schedule 2 (Adderall) with Intent to Deliver, contrary to Section 961.41(1m)(e), Wis. Stats., and is therefore subject to seizure pursuant to Sections 973.075 and 961.555, Wis. Stats.
- 3) That on April 28, 2015, the State filed a summons and complaint in this action, and that on June 22, 2015, the defendant, Robert H. Hetzel, was personally served with a copy of the summons, complaint, and affidavit in this case, by Officer Jeff Price of the Village of East Troy Police Department.


The Court hereby makes the following conclusions of law:

2. The vehicle forfeiture was subject to seizure pursuant to Section 961.55(1)(d), Wis. Stats., and was used in the commission of a felony, to-wit: Possession of a Schedule 2 (Adderall) with Intent to Deliver, contrary to Section 961.41(1m)(e), Wis. Stats.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED and adjudged that the defendant's interest in the vehicle is hereby forfeited and that title to the seized property is hereby awarded free and clear to the seizing agency, the Village of East Troy Police Department.



The above matter having come before the Court for a hearing, with testimony of witnesses, evidence presented, and arguments of the parties, on August 7, 2015, and based upon documents filed for the above listed case, the Court hereby finds as follows:

- 1) That the defendant vehicle is presently stored within the jurisdiction of this Court at the Village of East Troy Police Department in Walworth County Wisconsin.
- 2) That the defendant vehicle was used to transport property used in the commission of a felony, to-wit: Possession with Intent to Deliver THC contrary to Section 961.41(1m)(h)1, Wis. Stats., and is therefore subject to seizure pursuant to Sections 961.55 and 961.555, Wis. Stats.
- 3) That on August 7, 2015, the Court heard testimony and argument regarding the above listed defendant and defendant vehicle and the Court hereby makes the following conclusions of law:

1. That this court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Section 961.55(2), Wis. Stats.
2. The defendant vehicle was subject to seizure pursuant to Section 961.55(1)(d), Wis. Stats., and was used in the commission of a felony, to-wit: Possession with Intent to Deliver THC, contrary to Section 961, Wis. Stats, on March 25, 2015, in Walworth County, Wisconsin.
3. The above listed defendant is the owner of the above listed vehicle.
4. That the seizure of the above listed vehicle does not constitute an excessive fine or penalty.

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** and adjudged that the defendant's interest in the vehicle is hereby forfeited and that title to the seized property is hereby awarded free and clear to the seizing agency, the Village of East Troy Police Department.
