



During December 2015, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 181 incidents. This compares to December 2014 when officers handled 176 incidents.




## Adult Cases referred to the District Attorney's Office –22



## Juvenile Cases referred to the District Attorney's Office – 0




## Municipal Citations – 6




