


Monthly Incident Comparison 2013 and 2014

During February 2014, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 192 incidents. This level of activity compares to February 2013 in which officers recorded 210 incidents.




Charges/Individuals Referred to the District Attorney's Office – 0

There were no cases submitted to the District Attorney under this category for February 2014.




Criminal Cases Sent to the District Attorney's Office – 18

During February 2014 of the 18 cases referred, 15 were drug related arrests.




Juvenile Cases Referred to the District Attorney – 2

These are juvenile cases due to the severity or a repetitive offender, are referred to the District Attorney




Municipal Citations-11

Incidents of Note:

On February 1 at 5:25 pm, police responded to an apartment on Honey Creek, regarding keeping the peace while an individual picked up their belongings. When police arrived, they met with the complainant who wanted to get a voo-doo doll from the residence. The other half of this situation refused to turn over the doll to the complainant. Police attempted to facilitate an agreement when the couple can have counselors present during the exchange.

On February 1 at 10:30 pm, police responded to a request for assistance from the Town of East Troy Police regarding a traffic accident. On arrival at ES and Carver School Road, police found a personal injury accident and the driver of one of the vehicles had left the scene. Police assisted in looking for the female driver, who was not located until later.

On February 5 at 11:59 am, police responded to the 3200 block of Main St. for a welfare check. On arrival, police were able to detect a foul odor coming from the apartment. Police made entry into the apartment and discovered the sole occupant deceased. The coroner was contacted and responded to take possession of the body.

On February 6 at 6:00 pm, police stopped a vehicle in the 1900 block of Division St. for traffic violations. When checking on the driver's operating privileges, it was learned the vehicle operator did not have a driver's license. A subsequent check of the driver and vehicle led officers to charge the driver with traffic offenses and possession of marijuana.

On February 8 at 12:34 am, police responded to a bar on the square for a disorderly subject. On arrival, police met with the bartender who provided a description of the subject and stated he had left the bar. A subsequent search for the disorderly subject was unsuccessful.

On February 11 at 2:15 pm, police responded to the Municipal Court for a disorderly female. The female was upset with the court clerk regarding the fines and her driver's license was suspended. Police met with the subject and escorted her from the building.

On February 16 at 1:49 am, police observed a vehicle commit several traffic violations in the area of Main St. and Division St. When police stopped the vehicle, the odor of intoxicants was present. Police requested he driver perform Field Sobriety Tests which he failed. The driver was arrested for Operation of a Motor Vehicle while Intoxicated 2nd Offense.

On February 23 at 4:57 pm, police responded to a residence on Division St. for a rescue call. On arrival, police observed a subject in bed and on checking, the victim's condition determined he had been dead for a period of time. . The Coroner was contacted and responded to the scene. The victim was released to the Coroner.

Police make massive heroin bust

ELKHORN – A Burlington man was arrested on Feb. 19 with 184 grams of suspected heroin outside of an East Troy gas station.

Police also believe the man had 127 grams of marijuana, more than 100 grams of psilocybin mushrooms, 25 prescription pills that are Schedule II narcotic drugs and 29 prescription pills that are Schedule IV narcotics.

Several Walworth County law enforcement officials said that this is likely the largest heroin bust in the county in the last decade.

Phillip Zadurski, 42, is being held in the Walworth County jail in lieu of a \$100,000 bond.

During a bail hearing on Feb. 20, District Attorney Daniel Necci said police were called to the gas station to check on a woman's welfare. As of Thursday afternoon, charges have not been referred to the District Attorney's Office on the woman.

Necci said police eventually searched Zadurski and found narcotics. In addition to the large amount of the drugs, police allegedly also found several smaller bags of heroin and cocaine. They also allegedly found crack and heroin paraphernalia and \$1,325.

During the court hearing, Necci said Zadurski has an extensive criminal history.

Online court records indicate Zadurski has a 2012 conviction in Milwaukee County for felony possession of marijuana, as a second or subsequent offense.

In 2008, in Walworth County, he was sentenced to prison for battery and disorderly conduct.

During the bail hearing, TJ Wendell, an intern working under the supervision of attorney Julia May, said that Zadurski has lived his entire life in southeastern Wisconsin and had no money to post bond.

Necci responded by saying the heroin had a "street value of just under \$200,000."

Zadurski is next due in court on Feb. 27 in front of Judge David Reddy.

After the hearing, Necci said he has "no reason to believe at this time" that Zadurski is connected to the heroin ring that was uncovered in the Lake Geneva and Delavan areas earlier this month.

In the past two weeks, police have arrested eight people in connection with an alleged heroin-distribution ring.
