

In June 2013, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 250 incidents. This level of activity compares to June 2012 in which officers recorded 288 incidents.



In June 2013, Village of East Troy Police Officers issued citations or referred to the Walworth County District Attorney's Office the following:


**Charges/Individuals Referred to the District Attorney's Office – 22**

In June 2013, these included Bail Jumping, Manufacture/Delivery of Heroin, and Criminal Trespassing to Dwelling.




**Criminal Cases Sent to the District Attorney's Office – 3**

In June 2013, this included Bail Jumping Misdemeanor and Disorderly Conduct




### Juvenile Cases Referred to the District Attorney – 1

Juvenile Cases are referred to the District Attorney due to the severity or repetitiveness of an offender. This case was possession of THC.




### Municipal Citations – 13

Municipal citations are issued by officers for violation of municipal ordinances and are heard by Judge Cotter in the Village of East Troy Municipal Court. Initial appearance is normally the first Wednesday of the month and trial call the third Wednesday of the month.

## Incidents of Interest:

On June 1 at 5:57 am, police responded to the area of Church St. and the Railroad tracks for a fire. The fire was started in an illegally placed Port-O-Potty and spread to a tree and trailer in the adjacent driveway. The fire was extinguished by the East Troy Fire Department. Due to subsequent investigation, the Village of East Troy Building Inspector was notified and is looking into the property's conditional use permit. The property owner never approached the Planning Committee or the Village Board for the necessary approvals.

On June 1 at 8:09 am, police responded to a restaurant on Main St. for a male subject passed out in the restroom. The male subject was breathing however, non-responsive. It was learned the male had taken an overdose of heroin while in the restroom. The male was transported to Lakeland Hospital for treatment. He was charged for possession of controlled substances and drug paraphernalia.

On June 8 at 1:30 am, police observed a suspicious subject in a vehicle at a local gas station. When police spoke with the individual, he became overly nervous and was reaching under the driver's seat. Subsequent investigation found the vehicle was

unregistered and the subject had stolen license plates from another vehicle, placing them on the vehicle he was driving. He produced a driver's license from the state of Georgia and his privileges to drive suspended. After he was arrested a quantity of marijuana, syringes and suspicious looking "brownies" were discovered. (Note brownies with marijuana oil mixed in have been discovered on several occasions during the past several weeks.)

On June 9 at 12:27 am, police responded to I-43 near Hwy 20 for a female subject walking on I-43. When police made contact with the female it was determined, she was intoxicated. The female subject stated to police she had been thrown out of a vehicle. While speaking with the female, police observed a vehicle pulled off the road approximately 1/10 of a mile away. When police approached the vehicle, police learned the female was from this vehicle. Police spoke to the driver and noted blood on the driver's seat and cuts on his head. He stated the female subject was intoxicated and they started arguing and during the argument she attempted to exit the moving vehicle and he pulled over and she got out. While they were arguing, the female subject struck him about the head while he was driving. Police arrested the female subject for domestic battery and the male subject for operation of a motor vehicle while intoxicated.

On June 21 at 12:58 pm, police stopped a vehicle for driver's license violations. During the course of the traffic stop a strong odor of marijuana was noted. The driver and passengers were removed from the vehicle. One of the passengers resisted police and needed to be physically restrained. Police arrested three of the four individuals in the vehicle. Charges include possession with intent to deliver controlled substances and possession of controlled substances. Walworth County K-9 was called to search the vehicle for additional drugs. Two subjects were released after processing and one was transported to the Walworth County Jail on felony charges.

On June 23 at 12:35 am, police responded to a local bar for a bartender being struck in the face by a patron. On arrival police learned the offender had left and the bartender stated she attempted to break up a disturbance and was struck. Police were able to identify the offender and citations were issued.

On June 26 at 4:40 pm, police responded to the East Troy Middle School for a report of drug activity taking place. On arrival police observed two vehicles parked and several juvenile subjects. On approaching, the subjects' police observed one of the subjects was arrested on June 21 at 12:58 pm for possession with intent to deliver. This subject is an adult. He was arrested for bail jumping; as he was in violation of his bail by being with juveniles.

On June 30 at 5:16 pm, police responded to the 1900 block of Church St. for an anonymous trouble complaint. When police arrived, they found a female victim in the roadway upset, hurt and in pain. When police spoke with the victim they noted bruising on her arms and neck as if she had been physically attacked and choked. The offender was arrested, charged with strangulation, battery and disorderly conduct. He was transported to the Walworth County Jail.

**Officers:**

**Deputy Chief Swendrowski** – Received new radar units, which were awarded by a grant from the State of Wisconsin. He is completing the grant and closing it out. Two units were received and have been placed in squad cars.

**Officer Rhode** – Attended a school officer training called Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter and Evacuate (ALICE). The training was attended by school district personnel as well.

**Officer Ojeda** – Conducted range qualifications using the new course set by Wisconsin Training and Standards. He is working on implementing TraCs10 program as required by the state for electronic submissions.

**Officer Price** – Attended the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Center for Domestic Preparedness. Classes were for prevention of terrorism.

Chief – Attended range training in June, held a departmental meeting, met with school officials regarding continuation of the safety-training program. Met with chamber of commerce staff regarding bike race and issues concerning the race. Attended/worked the day of the bike race, not the best turnout most likely due to the weather. Attended a meeting at the Sheriff's Office regarding the SMART program. Met with State of Wisconsin Training and Standards Field Auditor (new one and said he just was stopping by, hmmmmm). Starting off a nice summer.

**Police Advisory Committee**- met with the committee members (separately due to committee member's commitments) and went over police department current budget. No problems noted.
