



During June 2016, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 233 incidents. This compares to June 2015 when officers handled 257 incidents.




Adult Cases referred to the District Attorney's Office – 12




These cases included Child Abuse Intentionally Causing Harm, 2nd Reckless Endangering Safety and False Imprisonment.

Juvenile Cases referred to the District Attorney's Office – 0




Municipal Citations – 15
