



During March 2016, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 224 incidents. This compares to March 2015 when officers handled 230 incidents.







Hello! Apologies for not getting this out sooner, I've been swamped this week, which is why I'm sending this out at 0300 on my day off (and no, I don't work the night shift). I promise to be more timely in the future....

Attached are the standings from our first shoot as well as the course of fire. The course of fire came from Pat Rogers, a well known firearms instructor, Marine, retired NYPD officer and owner of EAG Tactical. We modified a few things to make it a little more fair for everyone. The version we shot, as well as the original course is attached.

Our bird and turtle folks showed they can shoot! **Congrats to Ryan V. (WI DNR) for having the top overall score. Jeff L. (Capitol Police) took second, and Kyle D. (WI DNR) tied for third with Mick W. (Madison PD). Our top shooter in both the women's and rookie divisions was Nicole H. (East Troy).** I enjoyed meeting and talking with so many officers from different agencies around the state.

This was a very challenging pistol course with some tight time standards. Regardless of your score, you made the effort to come out and test yourself. That's more than many people are willing to do and I admire your willingness to put yourself out there. We only improve when we push ourselves and test our limits. In firearms, as in life, it is easy to fall into a rut of only doing what we are good at. It's fun to dump rounds into targets from five yards because we're all good at it. Hopefully this identified some specific areas for improvement for everyone. Take those "weak" areas and work on them so they become your strengths.

A few specific thoughts from February:

Marksmanship is critical in any kind of shooting. Marksmanship refers to the fundamentals required to hit your target. Stance, grip, sight alignment, sight picture, trigger control and follow-through. I say "simply" but we all know it's not that easy, especially once we start working on the clock. I worked with a number of you afterwards on some trigger press drills to work on that smooth application of trigger. When we start adding the time standard, we have a greater tendency to slap or jerk the trigger instead of pulling smoothly, straight to the rear. The trick is to learn how to press the trigger straight back, smoothly, all the time, and eventually... quickly.

Speed. You do not become a faster shooter by pulling the trigger faster... that simply leads to missed shots as we just discussed. Your best bet for improving your speed is to focus on your weapon handling - your draws, reloads, etc. Speed is gained through efficiency - through economy of motion. I often see students who are wasting tenths, quarters, even half seconds on their draws and reloads simply because they are performing un-necessary movements. The biggest two culprits I see are un-necessary movement of the upper body during

On Friday, March 11, 2016 Officer Price contacted Lt. Elder to advise that he had Cody A. Arn in custody. Officer Price advised they had information indicating there were potentially illegal substances in Arn's apartment, located at 212 W. Whitewater St. #2. Officer Price advised that they were actively attempting to seek a search warrant for the residence. The executed search warrant proved to be highly successfully, approximately 10+lbs of marijuana was seized, along with THC oil, THC candies, cocaine, a significant amount of cash, a bullet proof vest, and a handgun.

Officer Price's work in this investigation was exceptional, from the onset of the investigation through the executed search warrant and subsequent collection of evidence was highly professional. Officer Price's executed search warrant resulted in the successful apprehension of a known criminal and a safe conclusion to a potentially life threatening incident; most notably Arn's potential use of the handgun and/or the delivery of narcotics.

It is with this information that I would like to extend to Officer Price this formal letter of appreciation. Officer Price's professionalism, tenacity and commitment to excellence throughout the incident enhanced the successful outcome of the investigation. Please thank him for a job well done.
