


Monthly Incident Comparison 2015 to 2014

During March 2015, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 230 incidents. This compares to March 2014 when officers handled 242 incidents.




Adult Cases referred to the District Attorney's Office – 17

These included Identity Theft, Possession with Intent to Deliver and Drug Paraphenalia.




Juvenile Cases referred to the District Attorney's Office – 14

These included 2nd Degree Sex Assault, Reckless Endangerment and Drug Paraphenalia.




Municipal Citations – 33

This will be a summary of the training I attended this past week,

On Thursday March 26, 2015 I attended a training at The Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office for using cell phones and other technologies in crime prevention. The course was hosted by FBI, Milwaukee P.D. and Milwaukee HIDTA. The course taught ways to utilize federal and local resources to apprehend criminals using cell phones and social media accounts; this training also touched on creating under cover Facebook accounts to be proactive in preventing crime and identifying criminals. The training explained numerous scenarios where MPD was able to stop planned crimes before they took place because of the intelligence gathered on these undercover accounts. The training was well worth the time and I would appreciate and enjoy future training in this subject area and believe all officers could take something away from this type of training and knowledge of the resources available.

WE Energies: First Responder Training

I got a lot out of this training. I learned the correct procedures in dealing with downed wires during an automobile accident and how to handle the passengers if wires are touching the vehicle. Something I never thought would matter, but could possibly kill the passengers if you request them to exit after colliding with an electrical pole. Also important not to get too close as metal on our duty belts may attract hazardous voltages that are around the car to us. I learned that just because the pole that got struck appears to be okay, doesn't mean it didn't shake something loose down the wire which is why WE Energy's wants to be notified regardless of severity and always stay on scene until utility workers arrive. Something else interesting I learned is natural gas by itself will not burn. Before it will ignite, it has to be mixed with air in a certain ratio. Natural gas is not toxic, but is an asphyxiant. This training was very beneficial to me.
