



During May 2016, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 252 incidents. This compares to May 2015 when officers handled 248 incidents.




## Adult Cases referred to the District Attorney's Office – 13




Cases referred to the DA's Office included but were not limited to Resisting and Officer, Bail Jumping, Battery and Disorder Orderly Conduct.

**Juvenile Cases referred to the District Attorney's Office – 0**


