


Monthly Incident Comparison 2013 and 2014

During March 2014, Village of East Troy Police Officers handled or responded to 238 incidents. This level of activity compares to March 2013, when officers recorded 196 incidents.




Charges/Individuals Referred to the District Attorney's Office – 0


Criminal Cases sent to the District Attorney's Office-7

In March 2014, these cases include Carrying a Concealed Handgun Intoxicated and Child Abuse with Intentional Harm.




Juvenile Cases Referred to the District Attorney's Office-8

Juvenile cases are referred are due to the severity of the incident or the repetitiveness the offender. March 2014, these cases included Disorderly Conduct and Battery.




Municipal Citations-12

Municipal Citations are issued for local ordinance forfeitures and are heard by Judge Cotter in the East Troy Municipal Court.



Traffic Citations-108

Traffic citations are issued for motor vehicle moving and equipment violations, which include Operation of a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated.

Several Incident Summaries for Review:

On March 1, at 12:50 am police went to a local gas station for a citizen requesting assistance. Police learned a 22-year-old male was left at the station by friends and was unable to obtain transportation to his residence in Mukwonago. The man was taken home by officers.

On March 1, at 2:16 am police stopped a motor vehicle in the area of Church St and Union St, for having expired registration. On approaching the driver, police detected a strong odor of intoxicants on the driver's breath. Field sobriety tests were administered to the driver, which he failed. The driver was taken into custody, transported to the police department processed and released. He was charged with several violations and is to appear in the East Troy Municipal Court.

On March 7, at 12:30 pm police stopped a vehicle, for traffic violations in the area of Hwy 20 and Thomas Dr. While attempting to identify the driver and passenger, it was learned the passenger was wanted by Elkhorn PD for an active warrant. The passenger was taken into custody and during a subsequent search revealed a switchblade knife and drug paraphernalia. The subject was transported to the Walworth County Jail and charges filed for the weapon and drug violations.

On March 8, at 12:35 am police stopped a vehicle for equipment violations in the area of South St and Division St. When police approached the driver, a strong odor of intoxicants was present on the driver's breath. Field sobriety tests were administered which the driver failed. The driver was taken into custody, transported to the police department processed and released.

On March 8, at 10:48 pm police responded to a disorderly subject at a residence on Chafin Ave. When police arrived they were met by the complainant, who stated her estranged husband was refusing to leave the residence. As police arrived, the subject did leave.

On March 13, at 6:02 pm police responded to 2786 Main St. the trailer park for a neighbor issue. When police arrived, the complainant stated one of the other neighbors yelled at her children for playing football next to her trailer and then took the children's football. Police had the children move to a different location to play.

On March 31, at 1:50 pm, police responded to a business on Executive Dr. in the Village of East Troy. Police were advised by staff at the building a female in the lobby area was acting strangely and the concern was for the children with the female. Police spoke with the woman and found nothing wrong with her or how she was acting. The female did tell police she was extremely tired and was waiting for her ex-husband to bring one of her other children. Police left and no further incidents were reported.

On March 31, at 2:20 pm police responded to the East Troy Middle School for a student out of control. On arrival police learned the student had been swinging a board and during a subsequent investigation the subject had struck one of the school staff members. Juvenile charges will be filed with the District Attorney's Office.
