In April 2013, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 229 incidents. This level of activity compares to April 2012 in which officers recorded 264 incidents.








Criminal Cases Sent to the District Attorney's Office -0




Juvenile Cases Referred to the District Attorney – 7

These are juvenile cases due to the severity or a repetitive offender, are referred to the District Attorney




Municipal Citations- 47

Municipal citations are issued by officers for violation of municipal ordinances and are heard by Judge Cotter in the Village of East Troy Municipal Court. Initial appearance is normally the first Wednesday of the month and trial call is the third Wednesday of the month.

Incidents of Interest:

On April 1 at 12:10 pm, police responded to the area of Wetland Way, behind Gus's Drive-in for a grass fire. On arrival officers were directed to three juveniles who had been using Airsoft weapons and lighting firecrackers. The subjects stated the fire had started accidentally and they attempted to put the fire out. The subjects were detained and cited for several violations. The subjects were using firecrackers and taping pellets to the firecrackers. One subject was turned over to the Town of East Troy Police when it was learned he was making homemade bombs at his residence.

On April 1 at 10:24 pm, police responded to a residence in the Town of East Troy on a request from the Walworth County Sheriff's Office to assist a deputy with an individual who was combative in a vehicle. Police arrived and assisted until East Troy Rescue arrived. The individual was later placed under emergency detention by The Town of East Troy Police.

On April 4 at 2:00 pm, police responded to the Skate Park for a disorderly juvenile. On arrival, police identified the subject and attempted to speak with him at which time he began to swear and threatened to kill another juvenile at the park. The juvenile was transported to his residence to meet with his parents. Enroute to the juvenile's residence officers were threatened and the juvenile refused to stay at home. He was transported to Health and Human Services where he fought with officers and deputies. The juvenile was transported to the secure juvenile detention facility in Racine.

On April 14 at 12:03 am, police responded to a bar on the square for a fight involving 30 individuals. When officers arrived, the individuals ran. Officers did take several into custody and citations were issued for disorderly conduct.

On April 14 at 5:05 pm, police stopped a vehicle for traffic violations on North St. at I-43. Initial investigation led to the passengers arrested for drug related offences. Subsequent investigation lead to one passenger being detained on a hold for violation of their probation and charges being filed on the other for possession of stolen property, several laptop computers.

On April 29 at 9:35 pm, police responded to a retail theft complaint from a business on Main St. Police were advised an employee of the business had taken merchandise from inside the store and placed it out of a back door. When the employee went to leave for the day they were confronted by the store manager. The employee was cited for retail theft.

Officers:

Deputy Chief Swendrowski—attended Emergency Vehicle Operator Course for Administrators.

Officer Rhode—coordinated the Drug Take Back Program, which was held on April 27 and collected 96 pounds of drugs for disposal.

Officer Price—prepared seized vehicles for auction.

Officer Ojeda - handled three major incidents on midnight shift during the month of April 30-person fight on the square, the fire and a fatal drug overdose.

Records Clerk Gerber—continues to work on the Special Olympics Rummage.

Chief-met with school staff discussing school safety plans and training. Met with individuals from the chamber regarding the bike race. Met with Mike and Judy for department head meeting. Attended Emergency Vehicle Operator Course for Administrators. Vehicle auction for this round completed.



Public Response to DEA's National Prescription Drug Take-Back Days Keeps Growing

MAY 02 (WASHINGTON) –The United States Drug Enforcement Administration's (DEA's) Sixth National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day this past Saturday collected 50 percent more pills than the previous one, demonstrating the American public's continued appreciation and need for the opportunity to discard unwanted, unused and expired prescription drugs from medicine cabinets, bedside tables, and kitchen drawers.

On April 27, 742,497 pounds (371 tons) of prescription medications were collected from members of the public at more than 5,829 locations manned by 4,312 state, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies that partnered with DEA on the event. When added to the collections from DEA's previous five Take-Back events, more than 2.8 million pounds (1,409 tons) of prescription medications have been removed from circulation.

The National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day aims to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of medications.

According to the 2011 Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH), twice as many Americans regularly abused prescription drugs than the number of those who regularly used cocaine, hallucinogens, heroin, and inhalants *combined*. That same study revealed more than 70 percent of people abusing prescription pain relievers got them through friends or relatives, a statistic that includes raiding the family medicine cabinet.

The DEA's Take-Back events are a significant piece of the White House's prescription drug abuse prevention strategy released in 2011 by the Office of National Drug Control Policy. Disposal of unwanted, unused or expired drugs is one of four strategies for reducing prescription drug abuse and diversion laid out in *Epidemic: Responding to America's Prescription Drug Abuse Crisis*. The other strategies include education of health care providers, patients, parents and youth; enhancing and encouraging the establishment of prescription drug monitoring programs in all the states; and increased enforcement to address doctor shopping and pill mills.

Shortly after DEA's first Take-Back Day event two-and-a-half years ago, Congress passed, and President Obama signed, the Secure and Responsible Drug Disposal Act of 2010, which amended the Controlled Substances Act (CSA) to allow the DEA to develop permanent, ongoing, and responsible methods for disposing of controlled-substance medications. Prior to the passage of the above-cited Act, the CSA provided no legal means for transferring possession of controlled substance medications from users to other individuals for disposal. On December 21, 2012, DEA published a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking on the Disposal of Controlled Substances that seeks to implement the above-cited Act.




