In February 2013, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 204 incidents. This level of activity compares to February 2012 in which officers recorded 215 incidents.




In February 2013, Village of East Troy Police Officers issued citations or referred to the Walworth County District Attorney's Office the following:

In February 2013 these included 2nd degree sexual assault, repeated sexual assault of a child, tattooing a child and burglary.




Criminal Traffic Cases Referred to the District Attorney's Office – 0




Juvenile Cases Referred to the District Attorney – 7

These are juvenile cases due to the severity or a repetitive offender, are referred to the District Attorney. In February, these included Sexual Assault and Disorderly Conduct.




Municipal Citations- 14

Municipal citations are issued by officers for violation of municipal ordinances and are heard by Judge Cotter in the Village of East Troy Municipal Court. Initial appearance is normally the first Wednesday of the month and trial call is the third Wednesday of the month.

Incidents of Interest:

On 2 February at 12:32 am, police responded to a fight in progress in the 2900 block of Mallard Way. On arrival, officers contacted several individuals in the driveway of the residence and learned of a physical altercation. Two subjects were taken into custody, transported to the Village of East Troy Police Department for disorderly conduct and released.

On 2 February at 2:41 pm, police observed a vehicle, which had been reported as driving recklessly, commit several traffic violations. The vehicle was southbound on I-43 in the area of Hwy 20. On activating the emergency equipment on the squad car the vehicle initially did not respond and an additional unit was requested for assistance. When the vehicle was stopped the driver was found to be intoxicated by conducting Field Sobriety Tests, a PBT showed a .171 BAC (blood alcohol content). The driver was taken into custody.

On 3 February at 2:00 am, police observed a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed on Main St. at Beulah Ave. When police attempted to stop the vehicle the vehicle left the area at a higher rate of speed. Police were able to stop the vehicle in the Shell Gas Station parking lot where the driver admitted to attempting to elude police. The driver was taken into custody for bail-jumping, drug possession, possession of controlled substances and traffic offenses.

On 7 February at 8:30 am, police investigated a report of a sexual assault which occurred from August 2011 to December 2012. Witnesses were interviewed and a subject in the matter was interviewed and admitted to the charges. The subject was taken into custody and transported to the Walworth County Jail for a bond hearing.

On 7 February at 5:40 pm, police responded to a business on the square for a suspicious person. An employee contacted the police and described a subject who entered the business and asked when the last time the business had been robbed; and left the store. Police were unable to locate the described subject.

On 15 February at 1:30 am, police responded to a local hotel for a suspicious person. On arrival the clerk directed police towards an individual who appeared extremely intoxicated. The subject was identified and stated he was attempting to walk home. Police contacted a friend to provide a ride.

On 16 February at 12:16 am, police responded to an activated burglar alarm at a local closed business. Police located an open door in the rear of the business and on checking the business interior located a subject. The subject attempted to flee the officers and had to be physically restrained. The subject was taken into custody and transported to the Walworth County Jail.

Officers:

Deputy Chief Swendrowski - attended the first week of a three week course in Leadership in Police Organizations. The course is three weeks long and is presented a week a month for three months. He also completed the investigation to the Edwards St. break in and filed charges against several suspects.

Officer Rhode - completed a sexual assault investigation which was in conjunction with the Edwards St. break in and that suspect was transported to Walworth County Jail.

Officer Jaekl – arrested a subject found in a local business after responding to a burglar alarm. She was assisted by Officer Buer. She attended a legal update in Waukesha.

Records Clerk Gerber – continues to work on the Special Olympics Rummage Sale and attended the Grist Mill fundraiser for the police department on February 19.

Chief – attended the Wisconsin Chiefs of Police Conference, attended a school district safety conference, attended the Walworth County Chiefs of police meeting, attended the Special Olympics rummage sale fundraiser at the Grist Mill.

Vehicles ready for sale

2000 Ford Focus ZX3 The interior in this vehicle is in good condition, however, the door panels and dash do need some cleaning. The vehicle rides smooth and has good life left in the tires. There is a slight vibration and shake during braking, unknown if the vehicle is in need of brake pads and rotors. The paint on the vehicle is in good shape; however, there are some dings and scratches. Overall the vehicle is in good shape according to Kelly Blue Book which describes good condition as: 54% of all cars we value meet this criteria. This car is free of major mechanical problems but may need some reconditioning. Its paint and bodywork may require minor touch-ups, with repairable cosmetic defects, and its engine compartment may have minor leaks. There are minor body scratches or dings and minor interior blemishes, but no rust. The tires match and have 50% or more of tread. It also has a clean title history, with some service records available, and will pass safety and smog inspection.

1994 Cadillac Deville, the interior in this vehicle is in good shape, the leather seats have natural wear from use, however, there are no tears. The exterior of the vehicle has very minor rust in a few areas; however, the paint is in fair shape. The driver's side mirror is missing and the trunk latch needs repair to securely close. The vehicle rides very smooth. Overall the vehicle is in fair condition which is described by Kelly Blue Book as: 18% of all cars we value meet this criteria. This car has some mechanical or cosmetic defects and needs servicing, but is still in safe running condition and has a clean title history. The paint, body and/or interior may need professional servicing. The tires may need replacing and there may be some repairable rust damage.

1986 Toyota Celica Gt, this vehicle rides smooth and has fair interior with some stains, however no tears. The exterior has several rust spots. The vehicle is in safe operating condition, however, because of the exterior repairs needed it would fall under poor condition.

Village of East Troy police officers are collecting items to sell at a rummage sale on Memorial Weekend, May 23-26 in the East Troy Village Hall.


All proceeds from the sale will be donated to the Special Olympics Wisconsin Southeastern Area.

Students get safe one click at a time

Last year East Troy and six other high schools piloted Operation Click's first venture into Wisconsin.

The program, which has 14 successful years in northern Illinois high schools under its belt, looks like it will continue for the long haul in the area.

Operation Click promotes safe driving habits with teenagers, using positive reinforcement and rewards, according to Village of East Troy Police school liaison officer Bev Rhode, who is in charge of the program in East Troy.

This year East Troy High School students Lori Heinemann, Mike Mackesey and Frank Pelletier are helping to provide local leadership.

Rhode said participation of East Troy High School student drivers is going strong.

A total of 85 ETHS students have signed the Operation Click contract stating they would not have any violation of the law or discipline issues at their school.


Rhode said students have been getting into the habit of buckling up.

"Students and parents are more aware of the program," Rhode said. "Students will leave the parking lot and pull out their seatbelt to show me it's buckled."

According to Rhode, during the school's preliminary check for seatbelt compliance, East Troy's rate was 97 percent. During the school's second quarter check, the number climbed to 98 percent.

A final seatbelt check will be done in April.

Schools that have a

compliance rate over 95 percent at the final check can pick one student to be eligible to win a new car, donated by Kunes Country Auto Group.

Along the way, students will have the opportunity to receive preferred parking spaces, music downloads, and other awards for their safe driving behaviors.

AAA is the leading sponsor for the program and has pledged \$2,000 to each participating high school to be used to promote the safety program.

AAA will loan out their portable driving simulators for presentations and events and Rhode said Operation Click CARTS (Community Alcohol Resistance for Teens and Students) will be assigned to ETHS this spring.

The simulators make it possible for students to experience driving under normal conditions, driving while texting and driving while impaired.

Rhode said this year's program is more student-centered.

Students will have a chance to receive extra

keys for participation and awards for creating a driving safety video. A Student of the Year will also be selected among all participating schools. One of the eight high schools will also receive a School of the Year Award.
