


# 2013 Annual Report

## **Full Time Staff:**

**Alan Boyes**, Chief Boyes completed 6 years of service with the Village of East Troy Police Department on December 17, 2013. Chief Boyes has a Master's Degree in Business and Organizational Management from Webster University. Chief Boyes has attended the Northwestern University's School of Police Staff and Command and the Executive Management Program for Law Enforcement. He attended Chemical, Biological and Radiological Training (COBRA) for Police at the Center for Domestic Preparedness and Incident Response to Suicide Bombers and Prevention of Suicide Bombers for Police at New Mexico Tech. His law enforcement career started in 1978. He served with the United States Army Military Police Corps, Lincolnshire Illinois Police Department and the Village of East Troy Police Department.

**Jeremy Swendrowski**, Deputy Chief Swendrowski completed 14 years of service with the Village of East Troy Police Department on September 30, 2013. Deputy Chief Swendrowski earned a Bachelor's Degree from University of Wisconsin La Crosse and attended the Northwestern University's School of Police Staff and Command. Among his other duties, he is responsible for report approval and scheduling. Jeremy currently works the afternoon shift.

**Beverly Rhode** is the Department's Part-time School Resource Officer and a Patrol Officer. Officer Rhode completed 23 years of service with the Village of East Troy Police Department on June 29, 2013. During the school year, she works 16 hours a week with the East Troy Community School District and is normally the first officer contacted for any school and juvenile related incidents. She works with TEAM ETC and Operation Click. One of Officer Rhode's many duties include calibrating the Portable Breath Testing instruments.

**Ruben Ojeda**, Patrol Officer Ojeda completed 8 years of service with the Village of East Troy Police Department on May 16, 2013. Officer Ojeda has taken on one of the most difficult assignments within the department, managing the Traffic and Criminal Software Program (TraCS). 


Police department vehicles were driven approximately 64,607 miles in 2013, compared to 67,800 in 2012.




The number of criminal incidents police responded to decreased in 2013 from 2012 by 18.01%.




## Cases and Citations to Court


Criminal arrests where a citation was issued to the subject at time of arrest or and did not mandate a Bond Hearing in front of a judge or court commissioner.




Cases/ Individuals Referred to the District Attorney (Data Prior to 2010 not provided due to a change in case classification).





Traffic Citations are citations issue for OWI-1<sup>st</sup> offense and all other traffic related violations.



Municipal Citations are issued for local ordinance offenses and are heard in the Village of East Troy Municipal Court. 2013 saw a reduction in the number of individuals cited by a municipal citation. In 2012, 344 municipal citations were issued and in 2013, 237 municipal citations were issued



## Warning Citations

During 2013, police officers issued 355 warning citations, mostly for traffic offenses. The warning citations account for less than 20 percent of all citations or cases referred.

Warning citations are issued mainly for correctable vehicle equipment and registration violations. There are 3 types of warnings correct immediately prior to driving any farther, five or ten day correction notices. The five and ten day correction notices require the driver to bring the vehicle with the violation corrected to any police department and have an officer verify the correction has been made. The warning is then sent to the Village of East Troy Police department where the violation is noted as corrected. If the driver fails to correct the violation and does not return the citations to the Village of East Troy Police Department in the required time, the officer will send the driver a traffic citation with the fine amount and a court date which to pay the citation by. This citation is transmitted to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation where it is added to the driver's permanent driving record.

## Officer Training

The State of Wisconsin mandates all law enforcement officers have a minimum of 60 college credits or an Associate's Degree prior to certification as a police officer. (East Troy has four officers and one civilian staff member with a Bachelor's Degree or higher.) Additionally officers must attend 24 hours of training per year. Departments are required to send their full-time officers and part-time officers when the department is the primary employer.

Training is an important part of any police agency and is much more valuable to a smaller agency such as East Troy. On-going training keeps officers up to date. The training updates provided give officers the skills needed to handle different situations, which they may become exposed too. With continuing training, the public views the officers as a professional agency and holds the agency in higher respect. I have not included all the training the officers received during the year only a portion.

## **In The News:**

### **East Troy schools to boost security**

The East Troy Community School District will accelerate security improvements at all of its school buildings.

On Jan. 14, the board authorized administration to work with Bray Associates Architects to immediately proceed with plans to upgrade security at all school entrances.

Board president Brian Wexler urged the board to move quickly on its security plans following the fatal shootings of 20 children and six educators at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown, Conn., last month.

“If we don’t do anything, especially considering what happened out east, it would be worse than bad,” said board member Murry Mitten.

District Administrator Dr. Christopher Hibner said the district was already working to make security changes throughout its buildings prior to the Newtown tragedy, but the district has taken a second look at its security measures.

“We do look at our safety protocols and crisis management plans continually throughout a school year. Obviously when there is a tragedy like that, we absolutely will examine and reflect upon how are we handling things in our district,” Hibner said.

Currently the main entrances at East Troy High School, East Troy Middle School, Doubek Elementary School and Prairie View Elementary School are open and accessible.

“That is something that after the tragedy occurred, we have reexamined and looked at...trying to balance that approachable, accessible school district and the safety and security of our staff, our buildings and community,” Hibner said.

While Hibner didn’t detail every step of the plan for security purposes, he said his staff would work with Bray Architects to look at every building entrance.

Anyone entering school buildings will need to request entry via a video system. Plans also call for each entrance to have a foyer with two sets of doors.

The rough projected estimated cost is \$30,000 per entrance.

Hibner said the district has already made additional improvements to increase security in the schools, including installing door access readers to secure doors around the district.

On Dec. 11, Hibner, Village of East Troy Police Chief Alan Boyes, school liaison officer Bev Rhode, Building and Grounds Director Bob Ellis, Dean of Students Stacey Kuehn and Business Manager Kathy Zwirgzdas met to review the district's emergency procedures and safety plans.

The district is currently working with the village police to create new lockdown protocols and procedures.

Hibner said Kuehn is working to develop standardized language for emergencies so each building is using the same type of verbiage if a lockdown were to occur.

The district also purchased a cell phone to be used in the case of an emergency and is looking at emergency capabilities of its current phone system.

A training session has been set for March for professional staff.

"We want to look at our safety and crisis management plans, reviewing how are we being preventative, proactive and unfortunately, you have to look at being responsive in the case that a crisis were to occur," Hibner said.

Hibner said the biggest thing the district has promoted in past years is constant awareness.

"All of the families, parents, guardians, siblings and friends being very vigilant and always being aware of their surroundings. That can't be stated enough. There is usually always signals and signs," said Hibner.

Hibner said the district's buildings are safe, but the proposed changes will make things more secure.

The board plans to earmark the estimated \$200,000 from its fund balance to make the necessary improvements to school entrances.

The school referendum on the April 2 ballot includes \$340,000 in safety and security upgrades throughout the district.

Wexler said he didn't want to wait to make the recommended improvements.

"We wanted to be proactive on this. No matter what the referendum says. Even if we have to use the fund balance, how much is a life worth?" Wexler said.

Since planning alone for the security upgrades could take up to eight weeks, Hibner said the district would likely wait for the referendum results before any construction begins.

He said the planned improvements to the entrances are in line with the referendum plans.

## Woman gets six months for stabbing roommate

An East Troy woman who admitted to stabbing her roommate in the head with a screwdriver will spend six months in jail and three years on probation.

Police were called to an Edwards Street apartment on March 27 by a crying woman who was bleeding from her head and had blood covering her hands and clothing. The woman told officers that her roommate, Raquel Mayer, had stabbed her in the left side of her head near the temple.

After telling officers she was “in a great deal of pain and was becoming dizzy and light-headed,” according to a criminal complaint, she was taken to Aurora Lakeland Medical Center for treatment of the wound.

On Nov. 20, Mayer pleaded guilty in Walworth County Circuit Court to a felony count of aggravated battery – intend bodily harm. She also pleaded guilty to a felony bail-jumping charge that stemmed from a May 19 incident during which police found her outside an East Troy bar smelling of intoxicants.

Officers said she admitted to drinking in violation of provisions under which she was released on bail in the stabbing case.

Judge John Race on Jan. 24 sentenced Mayer to jail and probation and ordered her to pay \$2,080 in restitution to the roommate for her medical expenses. Race said Mayer could serve her jail sentence with work-release privileges, but must not use alcohol or illegal drugs.

## **Man sentenced for THC manufacturing, wife's trial to come later**

### **Marijuana-growing operation 'got out of control' defendant allegedly told police**

An Elkhorn resident has been sentenced in a marijuana growing operation busted last August and his wife is set to appear for a status conference on March 15.

Christopher Hass, 34 of Elkhorn, has been sentenced to a year in jail with Huber privileges and three years probation for one count of manufacturing and delivering THC, between 2,500-10,000 grams, and possession with intent to deliver, no more than 200 grams.

Hass pleaded guilty to one count each manufacturing and delivering THC and possession with intent to deliver on Feb. 8.

His wife, Michelle Kostuck-Hass, 38 of Elkhorn, has been charged with one count each of manufacturing and delivering THC, possession with intent to deliver, and possession of drug paraphernalia.

Kostuck-Hass faces up to \$35,500 in fines and 16 years in jail.

According to the criminal complaint, Village of East Troy Police Chief Alan Boyes stopped Hass on I-43 on Aug. 15, 2012, at which time he noticed a strong odor of cannabis.

Boyes searched the vehicle and found a Walmart shopping bag containing two bags of marijuana on the floor behind the passenger seat, containing a combined 62 grams.

Boyes also discovered a syringe, metal spoon with burnt residue, and a sealed packet of Suboxone, a Schedule III prescription drug.

Search warrants were executed on the couple's home at 7255 S. Woodpine Dr., Elkhorn, on Aug. 15, 2012, by area police departments at which time officers observed a marijuana growing operation in the basement with more than 75 potted plants in various stages of growth, according to the complaint.

The operation included growing rooms with lighting, ventilation systems, water, potting soil and other items used in the manufacturing of marijuana.

According to the complaint, Det. Matt Termaat of the Elkhorn police department also discovered two paper bags in the bedroom, containing a combined 144.6 grams of marijuana.

Kostuck-Hass was at the residence when area police departments executed the search warrants.

According to the complaint, she told Officer Jeff Price of the East Troy police department the couple began the operation in February or March of 2012 and it “got out of control.”

She said she had ordered the original seeds online and that she watered and provided lighting for the plants.

The complaint states she told Price her husband had constructed the growing rooms and they would sell the marijuana to friends for \$250 per ounce.

Kostuck-Hass pleaded not guilty to the charges against her on Jan. 28.

## **Fire damages two buildings on East Troy’s historic village square**

Police are investigating a fire that damaged two buildings on East Troy’s historic village square early this morning.

The large blaze was reported at 1:51 a.m. on Friday on the corner of Main and Church streets, according to Village of East Troy Police Chief Alan Boyes.

Firefighters from four different departments, including the East Troy Volunteer Fire Department, battled the flames and smoke pouring out of the buildings for about four hours.

Boyes said the building at 2877 Main St. that housed Peddler Resale Shop and Synergy HomeCare and four upstairs apartments and one lower level apartment was deemed a total loss.

The adjacent building, which housed KB's Barbershop and two apartments, was heavily damaged.

No injuries have been reported.

Firefighters and Village of East Troy Police officers and Walworth County Sheriff's deputies remained on the scene this morning.

Officials from the Red Cross have set up shop at neighboring business Red Door Café, 2887 Main St., to provide assistance.

Boyes said the state fire marshal is helping with the investigation, but it's too early to tell if this is an accidental or suspicious fire.

Additional information will be reported as it becomes available.



## **Beware of Fraudulent Activity**

The East Troy Police Department is warning area residents of two recent incidents that appear to be fraudulent in nature.

On Aug. 20, a 76-year-old man reported to police that he had received a phone call from the Federal Reserve Bank in Miami, Fla. The person on the phone stated that the man had won \$3,000,000, a Mercedes Benz automobile and \$100,000 in cash.

The man was told that the car and the cash were to be delivered to his residence and that he would receive the \$3,000,000 at a later date.

He was instructed to go to his bank and withdraw \$2,500 and put the money into Walmart money orders.

Police note that this is most likely a fraudulent activity and that no legitimate company would tell a person they had won money and other prizes and then expect the person to give them money in return.

Also on Aug. 20, a 69-year-old man reported to village police that he had received a letter postmarked using an international airmail stamp. The envelope contained a check in the amount of \$4,250. A letter accompanying the check stated that the check, from Navistar Inc., Nashville, Tenn., was to assist the recipient in paying a processing fee of \$3,850.

The man who received the letter told police he knew it was attempted fraud and wanted police to be aware of the situation. The man was advised by police to contact the Federal Bureau of Investigation at [fbi.gov](http://fbi.gov).

## **East Troy Police Purchase Body Cameras**

The Village of East Troy Board approved the purchase of eight new cameras by the Police Department at its Sept. 16 meeting.

With one village squad car being without a camera, Chief Alan Boyes brought the idea of purchasing eight new cameras that would be attached to officers' bodies, rather than vehicle.

"I think body cameras right now, some may take it as a fad, I think in five to 10 years officers will not be without a body camera," he said.

The cameras, part of Taser International's AXON line, would be cheaper by at least \$1,000, if not \$1,500, according to Boyes.

In reference to discussions with City of Whitewater Police Chief Lisa Otterbacher, Boyes said Whitewater is using these types of cameras and while there's some initial hesitation, Whitewater officers have really grown to like them.

According to Boyes, one of the key features of these cameras is when an officer turns and faces someone, the camera is seeing exactly what the officer is seeing.

"It's not the squad car a block away or 50 feet off, it's right there," he said.

## **Car Struck the East Troy Electric Railroad Trolley**

A 59-year-old Eagle woman was hospitalized after an Oct. 5 collision with an East Troy Electric Railroad car at the Byrnes Street railroad crossing.

According to a police report from the Village of East Troy Police Department, shortly after 3 p.m. a train from the East Troy Electric Railroad was traveling eastbound crossing over Byrnes Street.

The police reports at the same time, Sherrie C. Bay, of Eagle, was traveling southbound on Byrnes Street and allegedly failed to stop at the posted sign at the railroad crossing.

As she crossed over the tracks, she was struck by the oncoming train, at a perpendicular angle, causing severe damage to the vehicle. Bay suffered an injury to her back during the incident and was transported Waukesha Memorial Hospital.

Witnesses and passengers of the train told police they saw Bay fail to stop at the intersection, according to the report.

Village of East Troy Police Chief Alan Boyes said according to department records, this is the first incident the railroad has called the department about since approximately 2011-2012, which wasn't even an accident.

Boyes said the railroad has made complaints about crossings, specifically the crossing at Highway 20, and the department attempts to keep an eye on them.

"When we're able to, we'll watch that crossing," he said.

According to Boyes, the railroad provides the department with a train schedule so the department has an approximate time they can send officers to monitor the crossing.

"It's unfortunate, being a small department, but when we have the ability, we do sit out there," he said.

While some have been questioning the safety of the railroad, citing recent incidents of derailments, Chairman of the East Troy Electric Railroad Board Bernie Van Dinter said it's nothing to be concerned about.

"We've had a number of people make false and misleading statements over the past 15 to 20 years," he said.

"We've got a pretty routine operation."

Van Dinter, who said trains typically travel between five to 10 mph through the village, noted while incidents occur, they're typically not a concern and the railroad contacts authorities when it is.

"It's pretty much a non-incident," he said.

In the case of mild derailments, Van Dinter said the railroad can typically get trains back on the track using their own locomotive depending on the location.

In regards to an Aug. 25 incident, where a train slipped off the tracks about 100 feet from the depot, Van Dinter said the location played into how long it took them to get the train back on the tracks.

“The one referred to took us three days to get back on the rails, mainly because we were on the top of an embankment,” he said. “We couldn’t get equipment in there and our own equipment wasn’t adequate, so we had to hire a contractor.”
