




### Monthly Incident Comparison 2012 and 2013.

During December 2013, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 229 incidents. This level of activity compares to December 2012 in which officers recorded 226 incidents.




### Charges/Individuals Referred to the District Attorney's Office –4

During December 2013, these included Bail Jumping, and Possession of Control Substances (Schedule II).




**Criminal Cases Sent to the District Attorney's Office-2**




**Juvenile Cases Referred to the District Attorney – 0**

These are juvenile cases due to the severity or a repetitive offender, are referred to the District Attorney




**Municipal Citations- 7**

#### Incidents of Note:

On December 3 at 12:03 am, police stopped a vehicle at Emery and Douglas after observing erratic driving. When officers approached the driver they were able to detect an odor of intoxicants. The driver was given field sobriety tests and taken into custody. While officers were with the driver they also noted him chewing a green leafy substance which was determined to be Marijuana. The subject was transported to a medical facility where a legal blood draw was taken. He was then transported to Walworth County Jail and booked in on charges of OWI and Felony Bail Jumping.

On December 3 at 8:30 pm, police responded to an apartment on Lilly St. for an a subject who had intentionally taken an overdose of medication. The subject would not advise police the reason he ingested the amount of medication. The subject was placed under emergency detention and was transported to a medical facility by East Troy Rescue.

On December 7 at 5:45 am, police responded to an apartment on Lilly St. for a complaint of disorderly subjects. On arrival police heard from the outside of the apartment loud voices and people arguing. Police entered the apartment, found three subjects and the apartment in disarray. Police noted the conditions of three subject and they were intoxicated. Police observed alcohol, and controlled substances in plain view. The subjects continued to be loud and argumentative with officers and were placed into custody. Two of the subjects were arrested for Possession of Controlled Substances, Disorderly Conduct and Bail Jumping.

On December 12 at 2:35 pm, police responded to a request for assistance from the Town of East Troy Police for a burglary in progress.

On December 15 at 3:06 am, police responded to 2486 Main St, the trailer park for a report of disorderly subjects fighting in the street. When police arrived they spoke with the parties involved, all denied a physical altercation and stated it was verbally only. Police advised the subjects to stop any noise for the evening and warned them. No further incidents occurred.

On December 21 at 1:22 am, police responded to a bar on the square for a reported altercation outside on the sidewalk. When police arrived they found a female sitting on the sidewalk who was visibly upset. The female related that her and another had gotten into an altercation and pulling hair. After a speaking with all parties involved no charges were filed.

On December 29 at 8:01 pm, police responded to a bar on the square for a patron refusing to leave. Police arrived and noted the subject and that she appeared to be intoxicated. The bartender on duty asked the subject to be removed from the bar. Police removed the subject and provided her a ride to her home.
