


**Monthly Incident Comparison Chart 2012 and 2013.**

During November 2013, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 239 incidents. This level of activity compares to November 2012 in which officers recorded 219 incidents.




**Charges/Individuals Referred to the District Attorney’s Office –17**

During November 2013, these included Armed Robbery, Violation of a Court Order, and Disorderly Conduct.




**Criminal Cases Sent to the District Attorney's Office-1**




**Juvenile Cases Referred to the District Attorney – 5**

These are juvenile cases due to the severity or a repetitive offender, are referred to the District Attorney




### Municipal Citations- 10

#### Incidents of Note:

On November 1 at 7:28 am, police responded to the area of Main and West Streets for a child struck by a school bus. Investigation revealed the student was walking along the shoulder of Main St. and was attempting to cross the street without using a crosswalk. Witnesses stated the student just darted out into traffic.

On November 2 at 2:30 am police responded to a bar on the square for a fight in progress. On arrival police observed several subjects attempting to restrain a female who had assaulted another patron. The female subject was given a portable breath test which showed a .21 BAC and she was cited.

On November 2 at 5:30 am, police responded to an apartment complex on Lilly St for a disturbance. On arrival police both subjects fled the area. Police found an amount of blood on the floor of the garage a knife and broken bottles. Police were later able to identify both subjects.

On November 5 at 12:50 am, police observed a vehicle being operated in a reckless manner around the square. After stopping the vehicle police detected signs of impairment with the driver. Field Sobriety Tests were conducted and the subject was taken into custody.

On November 15 at 8:25 am, police were advised of a possible burglary of a residence on South St. The report was delayed and the time of occurrence between August and November 15. Investigation continues.

On November 18 at 10:20 pm, police responded to an apartment on Honey Creek Road for a domestic disturbance. On arrival police heard yelling and screaming coming from the apartment in question. During the investigation the subject was described as out of control and were taken into custody for domestic battery and disorderly conduct. The subject was transported to Walworth County Jail.

On November 19 at 2:09 am police responded to the area of the square for an armed robbery. When police arrived they learned that an unknown subject produced a knife and ordered the victim to produce his wallet. The victim resisted and the subject fled on foot from the area. At approximately 6:30 am police learned the subject was hiding at a residence on School St. Police responded to that residence and the suspect was taken into custody without further incident. The subject was transported to Lakeland Medical Center for evaluation of some cuts and later turned over to Walworth County Jail staff.

**Officers:**

Officer Rhode-conducted an investigation into a sex offense and learned the offense occurred in Mukwonago and the case was transferred to that agency. She conducted Lockdown security training at St. Pauls School.

Officers Price, Jaekl, Buer and Hackett attended a DEA sponsored training course on drug trends in Southeast Wisconsin. (See attached memo from Officer Hackett).

Officer Ojeda-continues to work on Tracs issues with the program up and running. Bugs are still being worked out with Officer Ojeda working with the Tracs office in Madison and Digicorp. He conducted handgun qualifications.

Officer Jaekl- responded to a fight in progress at a bar on the square which led to persons being arrested on warrants and violation of restraining orders.

**Chief**-attended a chamber meeting to discuss the 2014 Tour of America's Dairyland Race. Meet with union representatives and came to an agreement on the new contract for the police officers. Attended a meeting of Team ETC at the Village Hall. Took a vacation over the Thanksgiving Week.

Officer Price, Jaekl, Buer and I attended a training session that focused on drug trends in SE Wisconsin taught by the local DEA office. The afternoon focused on TTPs relating to drug overdose investigations.

We discussed local case studies and broke down the lessons learned. We were able to walk away with some insight into what a DA may be looking for when charges arise. The various search warrants needed for electronic devices and social media. What could go wrong at trial and how to deal with it. We were given a check list that a responding office can use when on the scene to ensure a smooth investigation.

I will be tailoring this checklist to fit our needs as it was developed for Waukesha County.

We found this training important as the rate of heroin/opiate related crimes has increased for us and other agencies in the area. These types of drugs fuel severe medical incidents as well as spawn habitual property related crimes.

This will be a report reference Investigating Overdose and Prescription Fraud held at The Milwaukee County Sheriff's Department; attended by Officer Jaekl, Officer Hackett, Officer Buer and Officer Price.

The training covered the prescription drug trends, predominately focusing on narcotic prescriptions; and the correlation with heroin and its increasing abuse. The course covered avenues available relating to fraud investigations and resources available to law enforcement. The second portion of the course related to overdose deaths investigation and included what evidence to obtain and possible criminal charging options. The course provided a case example presented by a Muskego detective showcasing the investigation from start to finish.

Overall the training was well organized and would be informative to new officers or officers with no prior narcotics training or overdose training. The training provided interesting and new statistics on drug abuse trends; however the material needed more than one day to be presented properly.
