



During July 2016, Village of East Troy Police Officers responded to or handled 216 incidents. This compares to July 2015 when officers handled 224 incidents.




Adult Cases referred to the District Attorney's Office – 7




These cases included Lewd and Lascivious Behavior and Possession of Cocaine.

Juvenile Cases referred to the District Attorney's Office – 0




Municipal Citations – 18


