Police Department 1st Quarter Report for 2021

On January 19, 2021, the Village of East Troy Police Department received certification that our Use of Force Policy complies and meets certain standards on use of force. This was a requirement to obtain grant funds through the federal government. Attached to this report is the certification and letter with further details.

Significant Calls/Cases

Bail Jumping: In January while an officer was conducting foot patrol around the Village Square, he heard a female yelling for a male to leave a local business. The officer contacted the male and observed he was highly intoxicated. During the investigation, the officer learned the male was on conditions of bond to not consume alcohol. The male was arrested for Bail Jumping and transported to Walworth County Jail. Charges were referred to the Walworth County District Attorney Office.

Domestic Battery/Disorderly Conduct/Criminal Damage to Property: In January, an officer was dispatched to a residence on Townline Road for domestic situation between boyfriend/girlfriend. When officer arrived, the boyfriend had already left the residence. During the investigation it was learned the male was intoxicated and he was yelling and spitting at the female. The male also broke the door frame to the residence. The officer put out an attempt a locate for the male. The male was located in the Village of Mukwonago and an officer of this department arrested him. The male was transported to Walworth County Jail. Charges were referred to the Walworth County District Attorney Office.

Possession with Intent to Deliver Cocaine: In January, an officer was on patrol and observed a male urinating outside in the area of Union Street and Division Street. The officer contacted the male and observed the male was intoxicated. Through the investigation the officer learned the male was on probation and not to consume alcohol. The officer contacted probation and they placed a hold on the male. During the arrest of the male the officer located cocaine in his possession and the male admitted to selling cocaine for a friend. The male was arrested and transported to Walworth County Jail. Charges were referred to the Walworth County District Attorney Office.

Child Abuse/Disorderly Conduct: In February, an officer was dispatched to a residence on Emery Court for a disturbance between a male and a male juvenile that live together. The officer arrived and during the investigation learned stepfather and son got into an argument that escalated to stepfather pushing and punching his son. The male was arrested and transported to Walworth County Jail. Charges were referred to the Walworth County District Attorney Office.

2nd Degree Sexual Assault: In February officers were dispatched to a residence on Fremont Street for an unknown problem that was called in by a 3rd party. Upon arrival officers entered the attached garage and were met by a female who was distraught and advising them of a male currently in residence that ran into a back bedroom with a possible weapon. Officers entered residence and were able to locate the male in back bedroom. During initial investigation and interview with the female there was an allegation of male sexually assaulting the female. Officers also located drugs in property of male. The male was arrested and transported to Walworth County Jail. Charges were referred to the Walworth County District Attorney Office.

Burglary: In February, an officer was dispatched to a business on Church Street for a burglary that occurred overnight. Upon meeting with business owner, the officer was able to determine entry to business was gained by breaking a window. Business owner was able to provide a list of merchandise that was taken by the suspect(s). A short while later a resident of the Village called to report finding a box containing merchandise in her residence. Officer responded to resident and was able to develop possible suspects. Officer was able to locate suspects and after interviews it was learned 4 male juveniles were involved in the Burglary. Charges were referred to juvenile authorities.

Child Neglect: In March, an officer received information regarding an incident of possible child neglect. During the investigation it was learned a parent of a 7-year-old and 3-year-old regularly leaves children home alone and during one incident the parent was arrested for OWI and the children were home alone during this arrest. Walworth County Child Protective Services was involved in investigation. Charges were referred to Walworth County District Attorney Office.

Disorderly Conduct: In March officers were dispatched to a business on Division Street for an intoxicated male causing a disturbance. While officers were responding another call came in from a business on Main Street whose employee pushed panic alarm due to a male inside the business causing a disturbance. Officers located the male and during investigation it was learned this male caused disturbance at the first business and left before officers arrived, and then went into the other business and caused a disturbance. The male was arrested and transported to Walworth County Jail. Charges were referred to Walworth County District Attorney Office.

Disorderly Conduct: In March officers were dispatched to a residence on Edwards Street for two males fighting. During investigation officers learned both males had been consuming alcohol all day together and got into an argument, which led to the physical altercation. Both males were issued citations for Disorderly Conduct.

OWI/Possession of Drug Paraphernalia/OAR/Warrants: In March, an officer was dispatched to a business on Main Street for a female that was slumped over behind the wheel of a vehicle. Officer arrived and observed drug paraphernalia on the floorboard of the vehicle. The officer was eventually able to waken the driver. During the investigation, the female admitted to being on a drug binge for the last three days. There were multiple warrants on the female, and she was on probation. The female was arrested and transported to Walworth County Jail and charges were referred to the Walworth County District Attorney Office.

Training and Meetings:

Officer Cain attended SET Training in March and Handgun Training and Qualification in March.

Officer De Meio attended Handgun Training and Qualification in March and Vehicle Pursuit Training in March. Officer De Meio conducted interviews with candidates for the part time police officer position.

Officer Hackett attended Handgun Training and Qualification in March. Officer Hackett attended two Walworth County SRO meetings.

Officer Heding certified the preliminary breath test instruments and conducted validations. Officer Heding investigated three ICAC tips the department received in January and February.

Officer Price facilitated Handgun Training and Qualification in March.

Officer Ojeda attended Handgun Training and Qualification in March. Officer Ojeda attended Online Instructor Training in January. In February Officer Ojeda attended Crisis Negotiation with Domestic Violence Subjects Training, Best Practice Considerations for Schools in Active Shooter or Other Armed Assailant Drills Training and Active Shooter: The Story and Aftermath Training.

Deputy Chief Rather attended the following meetings: Walworth County Anti-Human Trafficking Taskforce, Walworth County Executive Law Enforcement Association, and Walworth County Traffic Task Force. Deputy Chief Rather attended Handgun Training and Qualification in March and Investigating and Interpreting Video Recorded Use of Force Incidents Training in February. Deputy Chief Rather conducted interviews with candidates for the part time police officer position.

Chief Swendrowski attended Walworth County Emergency Communications Advisory Committee Meeting. Chief Swendrowski attended Walworth County Law Enforcement Executive Association meeting. Chief Swendrowski attended Handgun Training and Qualification in March. Chief Swendrowski attended online training on Confronting the Toxic Officer in February. Chief Swendrowski started in February for the next 6 months as law enforcement representative in OWI Court. Chief Swendrowski attended a one-hour online training regarding Code Enforcement.

Christine Fisher attended a one-hour online training regarding Code Enforcement.

Carol Nigbor attended online training on Public Records for Law Enforcement.

Use of Force Policy Certification

Agency: Village of East Troy Police Department

The Assessor is to review all relevant policies to determine compliance with the below listed mandatory requirements.

The Agency's use-of-force policies adhere to all applicable federal, state, and local laws.

Context

Compliance can be achieved by incorporating the above language into policy. If language is not present the assessor can find compliance if there are no procedures in their policy that would be in violation of the law, such as having procedures in violation of Graham v Connor, procedures in conflict with the Wisconsin DAAT Manual, etc.

In Compliance

Not in Compliance

The Agency maintains use-of-force policies that prohibit the use of choke holds, except in those situations where the use of deadly force is allowed by law.

Context

Policy must include a prohibition of chokeholds for compliance. The agency may elect to allow the exception for chokeholds in those situations where the use of deadly force is justified by law, or to ban chokeholds completely. Agencies choosing to maintain the use of a Vascular Neck Restraint as a force option must clearly identify the differences between a Choke Hold and a Vascular Neck Restraint in their policy and address any procedures, restrictions, or limitations on the use of the Vascular Neck Restraint.

Choke Hold – A physical maneuver that restricts an individual's ability to breathe for the purposes of incapacitation.

Vascular Neck Restraint – A technique that can be used to incapacitate individuals by restricting the flow of blood to their brain.

Dear Chief Jeremy Swendrowski,

On behalf of the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Accreditation Group, this letter confirms we are certifying that the Village of East Troy Police Department meets certain eligibility requirements, set forth by the U.S. Department of Justice, for discretionary federal grants. The Village of East Troy Police Department is qualified to receive federal grants for three years from the date of this letter.

Pursuant to Section 2 of the Presidential Executive Order on Safe Policing for Safe Communities, dated June 16, 2020, Executive Order No. 13929 (the "Executive Order on Safe Policing"), the U.S. Department of Justice's discretionary grant funding is only available to state, local, and university or college law enforcement agencies that have obtained (or are in the process of seeking) credentials certifying that they meet certain standards on use of force. The Executive Order on Safe Policing empowers the U.S. Attorney General to designate independent credentialing bodies — including the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Accreditation Group — to certify that a law enforcement agency meets the conditions of eligibility for federal grants.

Following our review, we have determined that the Village of East Troy Police Department meets the mandatory conditions for certification. Accordingly, the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Accreditation Group will include your agency going forward within our database of certified law enforcement agencies. On or before January 31st of each year, we will provide the name of each certified law enforcement agency to the Director of the COPS Office.
