## Police Department 1st Quarter Report for 2020

### Significant Calls/Cases

**Prowling and Trespassing:** In January an officer was dispatched to a residence on Church Street for a prowling complaint. A homeowner called to report he observed a male looking through his front window and this was also witnessed by his neighbor across the street who observed the male looking into the homeowner's window. The homeowner advised when he went outside to confront the male, he took off running. While the officer was investigating and checking the area for the male suspect, the suspect was located by the homeowner and neighbor to come running from a backyard on Church Street and attempt to get into a vehicle. The officer was able to take suspect into custody, conducted more investigation and question the suspect. Based on the investigation the suspect was issued municipal citations for Prowling and Trespassing.

**Domestic Battery/Disorderly Conduct:** In January officers were dispatched to an apartment on Lilly Street for a male and female yelling. Upon arrival the officers observed through open door of apartment the male and female yelling. The male and female were separated, and investigation occurred. The male was arrested for Domestic Battery and Disorderly Conduct and transported to Walworth County Jail. Charges were referred to the Walworth County District Attorney Office.

**Warrants:** In February an officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for speeding on Main Street. Both occupants of the vehicle had numerous warrants for their arrest from multiple jurisdictions. Both occupants were arrested on the warrants and transported to Walworth County Jail.

**Possessing Firearm While Intoxicated and Carrying a Concealed Weapon:** In February an officer responded to a reckless/possible intoxicated driver operating a pick-up truck exiting I-43 at STH 20, which was called in by an off-duty officer. The officer located the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle with two male occupants. Upon contacting occupants and during investigation the officer observed a firearm in between the center console and front passenger seat where male passenger was sitting. The passenger was removed from the vehicle and the firearm was found to be loaded and male passenger was also found with a fully loaded magazine in his coat pocket for the firearm. During investigation male passenger admitted firearm was in his possession and male passenger was found to be intoxicated. Male passenger was arrested and transported to Walworth County Jail. Charges were referred to the Walworth County District Attorney Office. Driver was released from scene with no charges.

**Theft:** In February an officer was dispatched to Piggly Wiggly for a Theft complaint regarding missing lottery tickets. During investigation officer was able to identify suspect through video surveillance from local gas station where suspect attempted to redeem stolen lottery tickets. Suspect was identified as a now ex-employee of Piggly Wiggly. Officer interviewed suspect and suspect admitted to theft of lottery tickets. Charges were referred to Walworth County District Attorney Office.

**Child Abuse:** In March an officer was dispatched to Children's Hospital for a 2-month year old from the Village with injuries consistent of maltreatment. This is still under investigation.

**Fraud:** In March an officer received a complaint from a person regarding fraudulent activity on his checking account and that he suspected his ex-girlfriend of withdrawing funds from his account. Through investigation the ex-girlfriend was identified as suspect who withdrew funds. Charges were referred to Walworth County District Attorney Office.

**Domestic Disorderly Conduct:** In March an officer responded to a residence on Main Street for a report of an altercation between male and female. Officer arrived on scene and through investigation officer learned the male was intoxicated and had damaged front door, smashed television and knocked items off the wall. Male was arrested and transported to Lakeland Medical Center for jail clearance and then to Walworth County Jail. Charges were referred to Walworth County District Attorney.

**Budget:**

100-21.52110-00340.000 Operating Supplies – Budget-\$2,000 With COVID-19 I have had to purchase additional PPE equipment etc. and disinfectant supplies for both the police department and squads. Based on these unforeseen circumstances this account is already over budget.

**Training and Meetings:**

Officer Ojeda attended CPR/AED/NARCAN training.

Officer Price responded to a SWAT callout for an armed barricaded subject in January. Officer Price attended CPR/AED/NARCAN training.

Officer Cain attended CPR/AED/NARCAN training.

Deputy Chief Rather attended meetings for Walworth County Pro Phoenix user group and NIBRS, and Walworth County Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force. Deputy Chief Rather attended the SMART meeting. Deputy Chief Rather participated as an assessor in a three panel group that conducted an on-site accreditation of the Wausau Police Department. Deputy Chief Rather attended presentation of a review of the mass school shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglass High School. Deputy Chief Rather attended the Wisconsin Police Chief Association Conference. Deputy Chief Rather attended CPR/AED/NARCAN training.

Chief Swendrowski attended Walworth County Law Enforcement Executives Association meeting, Emergency Communications Committee meeting, County-Wide EVOC Training Meeting. Chief Swendrowski attended Wisconsin Police Chief Association Conference. Chief Swendrowski attended CPR/AED/NARCAN training.

Due to COVID-19 numerous officers were scheduled to attend trainings in March that were subsequently cancelled.




