Police Department 1st Quarter Report for 2018

Significant Calls/Cases:

Possession of Narcotic Drugs/Bail Jumping/Underage Drinking: In January the department received information of an underage drinking party. Officers responded and located two individuals outside residence and one individual started to flee and resisted officers in taking him into custody. This individual was arrested for Possession of Narcotic Drugs, Resisting an Officer, Bail Jumping and Underage Drinking. During investigation of party 8 other individuals were cited for underage drinking.

Theft by Contractor: In January the department received complaints from three individuals of signing a contract for remodeling work and making a payment for materials and work and they never received materials and work was not completed. After investigation charges were referred to Walworth County District Attorney's Office.

Forgery/Counterfeiting: In January the department received a complaint from Citizens Bank of a person whom cashed numerous forged checks at both locations in the Village of East Troy. After investigation a male suspect was identified and charges were referred to Walworth County District Attorney's Office for six counts of forgery.

Armed Robbery/Recklessly Endangering Safety: In January the department received a complaint of a rescue call for a subject shot in the arm with a BB gun. While responding officers were advised this was an armed robbery and description of vehicle was given. Vehicle was located and high-risk traffic stop conducted. In the vehicle officers located the BB gun and other evidence. Investigation is continuing and department is waiting for results from Crime Lab regarding evidence collected. When results are received appropriate charges will be referred to Walworth County District Attorney's Office.

Sex Offense: In February the department received a complaint from a juvenile female who reported she was sexually assaulted by a known juvenile male. Investigation and interviews were conducted and charges referred to Walworth County District Attorney's Office.

Possession with Intent to Deliver Narcotics: In March the department received a complaint of a male attempting to sell prescription pills at a local establishment. Officers responded and through investigation identified suspect and he was arrested. Charges were referred to Walworth County District Attorney's office.

Sex Offense/Possession of Narcotic Drugs, Marijuana, Drug Paraphernalia/Possession of Firearm by Felon: In March the department received a complaint from a female juvenile who reported she was sexually assaulted by a known male juvenile. Investigation and interviews were conducted which led to a search warrant being served on residence in the Village of East Troy. During search warrant evidence obtained which led to further charges against those residing in residence. All charges were referred to Walworth County District Attorney's Office.

Budget Area: All accounts for the most part are on track for the year in the police department. The Repair and Maintenance of Vehicles budget amount for the year is \$8000 and at the end of March we had spent \$4,303.82. About half of this was spent in the first two months of the year on the Chevrolet Tahoe that we just traded-in this past week. With two squads under warranty now I am hoping the repair and maintenance of vehicles cost will decrease. You will also notice the Publication/Subscription/Dues account under Police Administration has used 83% of the budgeted amount. This account is used for memberships and subscriptions for the year and these are all paid for the full year in the first two months of the year.

Training and Meetings:

All officers attended a department meeting in February.

All police department staff attended CPR/AED recertification in February.

Chief Swendrowski, Deputy Chief Rather, Officer Hackett and Officer Heding attended the Walworth County Sensitive Crime breakfast where a representative from every law enforcement agency in Walworth County signed a sensitive crime/drug endangered protocol that will be used when investigating crimes of this nature.

Officer Ojeda attended a Safe and Power Training in March. This training consisted of place of worship and security protection focusing on obstacles facing churches and security related obstacles.

Officer Price attended monthly Swat Training and arranged through school district to use Chester Byrnes Building for the January and February Training. Officer Price continues to attend monthly Walworth County Drug Unit meetings.

Officer DeMeio attended Walworth County Special Event Team Training in January and attended 4th Amendment and Impaired Driving Update in March.

Officer Heding attended Teen Violence and Homicide Training and Forensic Interviewing Training in March. Officer Heding attended the inaugural meeting for the Walworth County Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force. Officer Heding certified the Preliminary Breath Test Instruments.

Deputy Chief Rather attended Intoximeter re-certification, WCLEEA meeting and FIRSTNET meeting in January. Deputy Chief Rather attended WIPAC meeting and Wisconsin Chiefs of Police Association Winter Training Conference in February. Deputy Chief Rather attended the inaugural meeting for the Walworth County Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force in March.

Chief Swendrowski attended Walworth County Special Event Team Training and New Chiefs and Sheriffs Training in January. Chief Swendrowski attended Wisconsin Chiefs of Police Association Winter Training Conference in February. Chief Swendrowski attended SMART meeting in March. Chief Swendrowski attended Emergency Detention/Protective Custody monthly meetings.

Ordinance Key

375-3 LITTER, RUBBISH OR DEBRIS

No owner or occupant shall accumulate or allow the accumulation outside of a building or accessory structure of waste matter, litter, refuse, rubbish, lumber, metal scraps, machine parts, discarded or nonfunctioning appliances, accessories, furniture or other material on such property which presents a blighted appearance on the property or which constitutes a nuisance or which tends to decrease the value of neighboring properties.

400-24 GREASE AND OIL SEPARATORS AND SAND INTERCEPTORS

D. In maintaining these interceptors and separators, the user shall be responsible for proper removal and disposal by appropriate means of the captured material and shall maintain records of the dates and means of disposal of the captured materials, including the name of the person or firm who or which disposed of the captured materials. Disposal of the captured materials performed by the user, the user's personnel, or by a licensed waste disposal firm shall be in accordance with applicable local, state, and federal regulations. Disposal records shall be maintained for a period of not less than three years and shall be available for inspection by the Village. Failure to maintain disposal records shall be considered to be a violation of this chapter and shall be subject to the fines and penalties stated herein.

423-8 OBSTRUCTIONS AND ENCROACHMENTS

E. Removal by Village for obstructions and encroachments located in the Village streets, alleys, public grounds or lands dedicated for public use. In addition to any other penalty imposed, if any Village enforcement official determines that a Village street, alley, public grounds or land dedicated for public use is obstructed or encumbered, he/she shall issue a written notice to the property owner of the premises which adjoins the obstructed public area directing that the obstruction be removed within 24 hours.

F. Failure to remove obstruction.

(1) If the owner or occupant fails to remove the obstruction within the time period established in Subsections D and E respectively, any Village enforcement official shall cause the removal of the obstruction, keeping an account of the expense of the abatement, and such expenses shall be charged to and paid by such property owner. Notice of the bill for abatement of the obstruction shall be mailed to the owner of the premises and shall be payable within 10 calendar days from receipt thereof. Within 60 days after such costs and expenses are incurred and remain unpaid, the Village Clerk-Treasurer shall enter those charges onto the tax roll as a special tax, as provided by the state statutes.

423-10 SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL

A. Removal from sidewalks. The owner, occupant or person in charge of any parcel or lot which fronts upon or abuts any sidewalk shall keep said sidewalk clear of all snow and ice. In the event of snow accumulating on said sidewalk due to natural means and/or by any other means, said sidewalks shall be cleared of all accumulated snow and/or ice within 48 hours from the time the snow ceases to accumulate on said sidewalk. Sidewalks are to be kept clear

of snow and ice to a minimum of four feet in width. In the event that ice has formed on any sidewalk in such a manner that it cannot be removed, the owner, occupant or person in charge of the parcel or lot which fronts upon or adjoins said sidewalk shall keep the sidewalk sprinkled with sand and/or salt to permit safe travel by pedestrians.

423-16 UNIFORM SYSTEM OF NUMBERING HOUSES AND BUILDINGS

J. Street numbers to be displayed. The owner, occupant or agent in charge of the premises shall cause to be affixed and to be maintained when so affixed to each principal building controlled by him/her the official street number assigned to that building, as provided in Subsection A hereof. The physical numbers provided herein shall not be less than 2 1/2 inches high on a background of not less than three inches. Each required number shall be affixed on the particular building in such a location that it may be easily and readily seen by a person of ordinary eyesight on the public street or highway upon which the building abuts. For buildings abutting also on a public alley, the street number shall also be affixed in such location that it may be seen in like manner from such alley. Whenever any building is situated more than 50 feet from the street line, the number of such building shall be conspicuously displayed at the street line near the walk, driveway or common entrance to such building and upon the gatepost, fence, tree, post or other appropriate place so as to be easily discernible from the sidewalk. Nothing contained in this subsection shall be construed to prohibit the use of additional sets of numbers at other locations on the premises.

458-19 STOPPING OR PARKING PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN SPECIFIED PLACES

D. Parking vehicle for repair or to display for sale prohibited.

(1) No person shall stand or park a vehicle on any street, alley, public right-of-way or municipal parking lot in the Village of East Troy for the purpose of repairing said vehicle or to display such vehicle for sale. No person shall park on any street or avenue any vehicles for the primary purpose of advertising.

458-29 PARKING OF TRUCKS, TRACTORS, BUSES AND OTHER HEAVY OR LARGE VEHICLES

A. Parking. No person owning or having control of any truck, trailer, truck power unit, tractor, bus or recreation vehicle or combination of vehicles weighing in excess of 12,000 pounds gross weight, or over 21 feet in length (including accessories, racks or other physical extensions), or having a height of more than eight feet from the roadway, shall park the same upon any street, avenue, public way or private property in the Village, in areas zoned residential or primarily residential in nature. The provisions of this subsection shall not be deemed to prohibit the lawful temporary parking of such equipment upon any street, avenue, public way or private property in the Village for actual loading or unloading of goods, wares or merchandise; provided, however, that loading and unloading, as used in this section, shall be limited to the actual time consumed in such operation. The Village Board may, however, designate specific truck parking zones.

458-39 DRIVING OVER CURBING OR SAFETY ISLANDS.

A. Driving over curbing prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any motor vehicle to be driven or backed over any curbing in the Village of East Troy.

461-3 PROHIBITED ACTS

No person, firm, partnership or corporation shall leave unattended any junked, stored or abandoned vehicle for such time and under such circumstances as to cause the vehicle to reasonably appear to have been abandoned. No person shall store any such junked or abandoned vehicle on public or private property within the Village of East Troy for longer than 10 days without making application to the Village Board for a permit herein described. A motor vehicle shall not be considered an abandoned motor vehicle when it is out of ordinary public view or when designated as not abandoned by a duly authorized municipal official or when designated as not abandoned pursuant to a permit issued hereunder.

470-6 COLLECTION OF REFUSE

B. Restriction on time of placement.

- (1) Receptacles and containers for refuse and rubbish shall be placed in collection locations as designated in Subsection A above prior to 6:00 a.m. of the scheduled collection day, but not more than 24 hours prior to such time.
- (2) All receptacles, bags and containers for refuse and garbage disposal shall be removed from the curbside collection point within 24 hours after the regular collection time.

510-47 ACCESSORY LAND USES AND STRUCTURES

A. Accessory uses are land uses which are incidental to the principal activity conducted on the subject property. In addition to specific requirements for each accessory use listed under Subsections B through W, accessory land uses shall adhere to the following requirements:

- (5) Accessory uses and structures shall not be located between a principal building and a street frontage on the same lot, nor within any required front yard or street side yard, except when there is a shore yard. In instances where there is a shore yard, shore yards shall be treated as front yards and street yards as rear yards, whereby accessory structures may be located between a principal building and a street frontage on the same lot.
- (7) Accessory uses in residential zoning districts.
 - (a) Accessory uses and detached accessory buildings are permitted in the rear yard only of residential zoning districts.

510-93 OFF-STREET PARKING AND TRAFFIC CIRCULATION

I. Locational prohibitions for off-street parking areas.

- (1) Off-street parking shall not be located between the principal structure on a residential lot and a street right-of-way, except within residential driveways and parking lots designated on the approved site plan.

510-93.1 MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAILERS ON RESIDENTIAL LOTS

B. Trailers. One trailer; or one boat, with or without a trailer; or one camping trailer may be kept out-of-doors overnight on residential lots, provided it is (1) registered and licensed, if so required for use by the State of Wisconsin; (2) used by the residents living on the subject

property or their temporary guests; and (3) placed on a driveway, but not within the public right-of-way, or on an auxiliary parking bay as permitted by this code. In addition, the aforementioned trailers may be kept overnight on an unsurfaced area of the lot, provided:

- (1) Two trailers are allowed provided the cumulative total of the trailer(s) shall not exceed 30 feet in length, excluding trailer hitch, tongue, and bumper.
- (2) The trailer must be at least 6 feet from a principal building and at least 5 feet from any lot line.
- (3) The trailer shall not be located in the front yard or the street yard.
- (4) The trailer shall not exceed 10 feet in height above the ground surface as parked, but excluding mast.
- (5) The trailer shall not exceed 9 feet in width, excluding any auxiliary hardware.


